# Women's History Month

Emma Hart Willard was a pioneer for women's education and women's rights to education. She founded the Troy Female Seminary in 1821, the first school in the United States exclusively for the education of women. At that time, women were often excluded from higher education and professional careers, and their opportunities for learning and personal growth were limited. The school provided young women with access to a guality education that was comparable to what was available to men, which was a rare and progressive idea during that era. The school challenged societal attitudes towards women's education and helped to pave the way for greater educational opportunities and advancements for women in the years to come. Today, the Troy Female Seminary, which later became the Emma Willard School, is still open and operating as a prestigious college preparatory school for girls in grades 9-12. It has a long and rich history of providing young women with a rigorous education and empowering them to become leaders in their fields.



#### **Career Readiness**



Mr. Jerome Watkins was a recent facilitator of LAW CAMP with BOSS students. LAW CAMP is an intensive program designed to enhance interest in the study of law that may lead to careers in the legal profession. The program provides instruction and classes that are actually taught in law school. Here are three examples of careers that students can pursue after participating in a program like LAW CAMP:

Corporate Lawyer: Corporate lawyers provide legal advice to businesses on matters such as mergers and acquisitions, contracts, intellectual property, and regulatory compliance.
